Susan Marie Swanson, St. Paul children's book author, poet and educator.

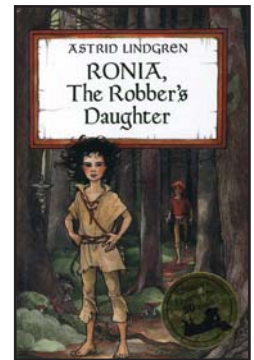

Professor Poul Houe states, "Arguably the most world famous among 20th century Swedes (next to filmmaker Ingmar Bergman), Astrid Lindgren, who died in 2002, penned some forty children's books, inspired countless picture books, plays, songbooks, feature films, radio and TV series, and was the recipient of the Hans Christian Andersen Prize (the 'Nobel' for writers of children's books). Like her most reputed character, Pippi Longstocking, this iconic author has for decades been "an international favorite" whose major works have sold in 100 million copies and been translated into seventy-five languages...the "author of the *Pippi Longstocking* books (1945-48), *Mio, My Mio* (1954), *The Brothers Lionheart* (1973), *Ronja, the Robber's Daughter* (1981), and a host of other Lindgren classics, is a story of unusual complexity for the realm of children's literature."

FROM THE KERLAN FRIENDS PRESIDENT

Dear friends,

I am happy to send greetings as the new president of the Kerlan Friends board. I am no stranger to the Kerlan, having served on the board for two years, and having appreciated the wonderful resource that the Kerlan Collection offers for many years before that. But it's exciting to become more involved.

My connection to children's books includes: reading a great deal as a child, and taking those books to heart; reading with my own children, and organizing reading and writing projects at their school; founding and editing *Riverbank Review*, a national magazine about children's literature that had a six-year publishing life from 1998-2003.

In addition to reviewing new works, *Riverbank Review* made a point of drawing readers' attention to older books—books that might be out of print, that might have language and themes that anchor them in another era, but that deserve to be discovered by contemporary readers. Because many of the books I loved when I was young were (even then) books "of the past," my interest in the historic sweep of children's literature has been growing since I was a child. For this reason, the Kerlan feels like a friendly home to me.

One of the subjects Emily Arnold McCully touched on in her recent Chase Lecture at the U of M was the danger that today's young people will be less engaged with and aware of history than past generations. Whether it is to investigate literary history, political history, or personal history, looking back, as McCully says, "with honest eyes" and with imagination, offers us the opportunity to learn things about the present and about ourselves that we cannot fully grasp if we stay locked in our own moment in time. The Kerlan, therefore, doesn't just offer access to "beautiful old books," but to the ideas and values and sensibilities of artists and writers across time. It is an important resource, worth preserving.

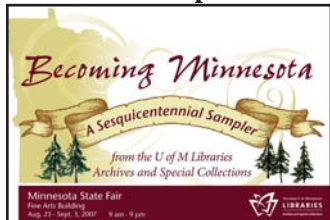

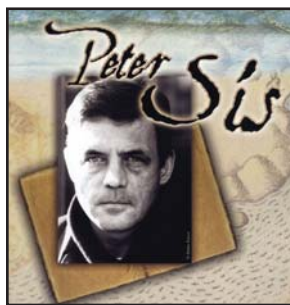

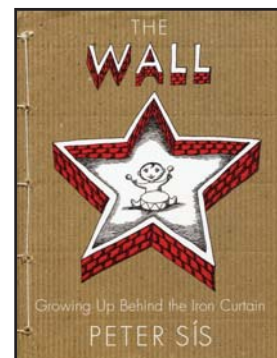
Guest Speaker Peter Sís - October 4th, 2007

On Thursday, October 4th, 2007 at 4:45 in Elmer L. Andersen Library, Room 120, MacArthur Fellow and internationally renowned artist, Peter Sís, discusses his memoir, *The Wall: Growing Up Behind the Iron Curtain*. The Communist Czechoslovakia of Mr. Sís's youth was a place where creativity could be discouraged but not easily killed. Graphic art, journal entries, and personal photographs illustrate the harsh realities of a closed society and the inevitable longing for freedom. Václav Havel, former president of the Czech Republic, says, "Peter Sís's book is most of all about the will to live one's life in freedom and should be required reading for

Twin Cities Book Festival - October 13th, 2007

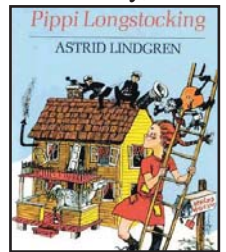

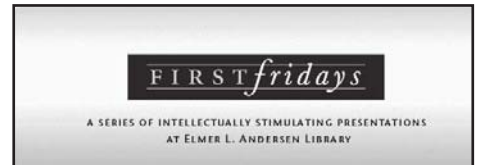

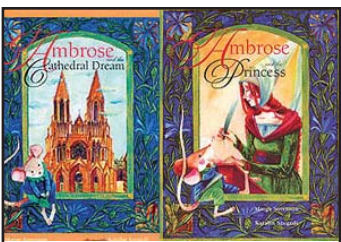

IN MEMORIAM

Clyde Robert Bulla, a prolific writer who captivated young readers for decades with his stories of Abraham Lincoln, George Washington, Pocahontas, and other historical figures, as well as tales of contemporary boys and girls, died Wednesday May 23rd at his home in Warrensburg, Mo. He was 93.

Mr. Bulla, who spent most of his adult life in Los Angeles, wrote more than 60 children's books, most fiction but some nonfiction, starting in 1946 with *The Donkey Cart*. Friends with Dr. Irvin Kerlan, he had given to the Kerlan Collection manuscript material for twenty titles, including *The Sugar Pear Tree*, illustrated by Taro Yashima.

2008 KERLAN AWARD

The Kerlan Award is given annually "in recognition of singular attainments in the creation of children's literature and in appreciation for generous donation of unique resources to the Kerlan Collection for the study of children's literature."

The Kerlan Award Committee invites nominations for the forthcoming Kerlan Award. Individuals from all areas of children's literature, including authors, illustrators, editors, publishers, and educators, are eligible for this honor. Please submit nominations in order of highest recommendation to the Children's Literature Research Collections (CLRC) by October 15, 2007. The winning individual will be announced in spring 2008.

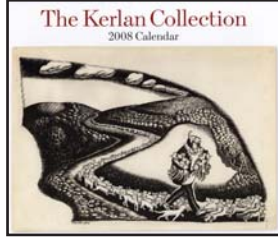

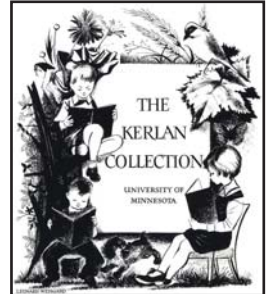

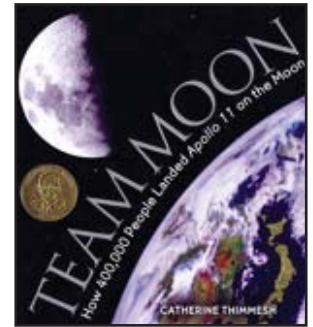
